

This is a fair copy from the archives of the Lodge, as listed in the "original" Lodge Register, with additions made from the surviving minutes of the Lodge the order in the original is as transcribed below, and the Brothers are not listed in the order in which they received their degrees. It would appear to be a fair copy begun in 1866, as the first 400 entries seem to be in the same hand, with two different contemporary pens. I suspect that this is some way involved with the fable that one of the secretary's went mad, and destroyed the records of the Lodge.

The first group of Brothers are not listed at all in this register, and so precede the entry below as 1

From the Grand Lodge History Published in 1904 we have the following:

To the R't Worshipful the Grand Lodge of the State of New York.

We, your petitioners, being the free and accepted Master masons who at present of have been member of regular Lodges, and having the prosperity of the fraternity at heart, are willing to exert our best endeavors to promote and diffuse the genuine principles of Masonry, that for the conveniency of our respective dwellings and other good reason we are desirous of forming a new Lodge in the City of New York to be named "Mariners Lodge".

That in consequence of this desire we pray for a letter of dispensation, or a warrant of constitution, to empower us to assemble as a regular Lodge, to discharge the duties of Masonry in a regular and constitutional manner according to the original form of the orders and regulations of this Grand Lodge.

We have nominated and do recommend BB. Geo Arnold to be the first Master; Br. Sam'l Morton to be the first Senior Warden; Br. J's T Harding to be the first Junior Warden of said Lodge; if the prayer of your petitioners be granted we promise a strict conformity to all the constitutional laws and regulations of the Grand Lodge.
